Sir,—One appreciates the courage, devotion and hardships endured by Miss Dibden over the years, in her effort to care for abandoned babies particularly during the Japanese occupation, but one paragraph in the article by your reporter, on July 3, which reads, "On her return from rehabilitation, that Home at Fanling had been taken over by a missionary group working under a committee" is misleading, and moreover incorrect.

It should read:—"When Miss Dibden resigned from the Fanling Babies' Home, the missionary group who had been with her from the beginning, continued administrating the work until 1962, when Christian Children's Fund Inc, with whom the Home had been closely affiliated and financially supported since 1939, took over, and the missionary group relinquished its executive power."
